B. The school maintains a small infirmary whose use, including standard infirmary medicines and diets, is furnished to sick boys without charge. Any special prescriptions, diets, etc. will be charged to the boy's account at cost. The infirmary is administered by a registered nurse.

- C. We have made arrangements with a dentist for emergency dental care, though we request that routine dental work be done at home during vacation times. We also have made arrangements with an outstanding orthodontist to continue treatment prescribed by the boy's hometown orthodontist, and we will be glad to see that the boy is kept to whatever schedule of visits is necessary. The dental bills are sent directly to the parents by the dentist.
- D. Before a boy enters school, parents are asked to have their family physician fill out a blank provided by the school.
- E. If you have medical, dental or hospital insurance, it will be to your advantage to let our office know to what extent you are covered.
- F. Our staff has been chosen with discretion and is ever aware of its obligation to employ every possible precaution to safeguard the health and welfare of each boy, and we have never had a serious illness or accident. While the Boychoir School does not stand liable in case of accident or sickness, it will do all in its power to assure proper treatment.

FINANCIAL

- A. Parents will be billed for tuition and fees at the beginning of each semester, or as indicated on their Tuition Plan Contract. Please do not include payments for Student Bank deposits or other expenses in your check for tuition payments.
- B. We have a Student Bank system which has proved most effective in handling allowances and incidental expenses. Each boy has a Student Bank account, and he will learn the rudiments of personal budgeting as well as banking procedures from its use.
 - 1. Parents may deposit a check in their son's Student Bank account at the beginning of each semester, in an amount sufficient to cover his allowance and the various expenses chargeable to the account. Whenever a boy's Student Bank account is close to "going into the red", the parents are notified. At the end of the year, parents may request an itemized statement, and any balance remaining in Student Bank is withdrawn by the parent after all bills are paid.
 - 2. Your son may withdraw his allowance from Student Bank at two scheduled times during the week (generally Tuesday and Friday afternoons). It is requested that boys be limited to \$2.00 per week for spending money (to cover movies,
