LAUNDRY AND CLEANING

- A. Because we have a linen rental service at 65¢ per week, which provides each boy with two sterile-clean sheets, two bathtowels and a pillowcase each week, only personal laundry must be handled by the boy. This personal laundry may be handled in two ways:
 - 1. A student may send his laundry home in a regulation mailing box. Parents should see that the reversible address label is properly filled out. If your son sends his laundry home, please bear in mind that he must have a sufficient supply of clothing to last him until you can return the box to him. Laundry cases are mailed from here on Saturday mornings, with postage charged to Student Bank.
 - 2. A student may send his laundry to a commercial laundry here and charge the costs to his Student Bank account. The type of service that seems preferable is "finished" shirts, handkerchiefs, etc.; the rest "rough dry".
- B. Dry cleaning is serviced by our local laundry, as is shoe repair. The school takes dry cleaning in on Saturday mornings, and usually receives it back again by Wednesday. Bills are charged to the boy's Student Bank account. The dry cleaners also maintain a mending and tailoring service when needed.

IMPORTANT: Each boy should be provided with a sturdy laundry bag upon coming to school.

EQUIPMENT AND BEDDING

- A. A footlocker or trunk of footlocker size is recommended for shipping, and for storing out-of-season clothes. Boys should also have a suitcase for touring and such other luggage as is necessary. It is wise to keep one trunk key at home.
- B. No pets, guns or bicycles permitted. Knives should be checked in upon arrival and those considered unsuitable for carrying will be kept for the boy's supervised use.
- C. Boys may bring radios, desk lamps, book ends, etc. for their own rooms, as well as cameras, stamp albums and other hobby equipment.
- D. Bedding (boys sleep in double-deck bunk beds)
 - 1. Cot-size mattress covers and/or mattress pads are very helpful. Covers with retaining straps at the corners are best.
 - 2. Each boy should have three blankets, one quite warm. If you
