should send one dark Army type or Hudson Bay type it may be used for a bedspread. In the Cottage matching bedspreads are used which may be purchased at \$6 or rented at \$2 per year.

- 3. In cases where necessary, boys should bring rubber sheeting.
- 4. If your son prefers a foam-rubber pillow, please send one along with him.
- E. Although sheets, towels and pillowcases are furnished by the linen service, you may wish to send along two or three extra bathtowels for swimming weather. Washcloths, soap, etc. must be furnished by the parents.

CLOTHING

IMPORTANT: Every item of clothing, as well as every other personal possession of your son (including blankets, etc.) should be plainly and permanently marked with his name.

- A. General items of clothing: For everyday use, your son will wear just about what he would wear at home. These should include:
 - 1. Blue jeans or corduroys, T-shirts, flannel shirts for wear around the school.
 - 2. A good supply of underwear and socks.
 - 3. A suit or slacks and sport jacket for wear into town for church and on Friday and Saturday nights (boys may never go into town in jeans).
 - 4. At least two pairs of shoes, in addition to those worn in concert. Shoes <u>must not</u> have metal cleats or pieces on the bottom, as they would cause damage to our carpets and flooring.
 - 5. A pair of tennis shoes is ideal for fall and spring out-door play; if your son is a fisherman, he may want to bring his hip boots.
 - 6. Rubbers and galoshes are very necessary. We live out in the country and it gets pretty muddy. A raincoat is also a necessity.
 - 7. Each boy should have a heavy jacket for play in cold weather, as well as a lighter-weight jacket or sweater for warmer days.
