RECORDING dates for the new Decca album of folk songs and spirituals sung by the Columbus Boychoir will be May 22nd and 23rd. Forty boys will comprise the choir. Besides unaccompanied numbers, selections will be accompanied variously on banjo, guitar and harp. Two other albums, both under the Decca label, are currently available: "Joy to the World," a Christmas record made two years ago in both monaural and stereophonic versions, and "Festival of Song," offering a general program recorded several years earlier, monaural only.
