About the Choir

The United Fund is indebted for the third year to the Westminster Choir College for their participation in the United Festival of Song. This year we are privileged to present the Westminster Chapel Choir representing some 90 students who are in their first year at the College.

The Chapel Choir concertizes extensively throughout New Jersey, eastern Pennsylvania, and southern New York each year. Upon entrance to Westminster, students receive their first experience in choral methods and choir training in the Chapel Choir and thereafter many of them become part of the Westminster Choir (touring choir). Coming from High Schools from all over the country, most of these singers have had no formal instruction in voice prior to their training at Westminster Choir College and their presentation tonight demonstrates the excellent training and quality of this group which has been developed since last September.

For many years prior to 1955, this Chapel Choir also performed regularly at the services of the First Presbyterian Church here in Princeton.
